COURSE DESCRIPTION: AEDE 503 will examine the economic tools for analyzing public policy.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

- ▶ **Explore** economic performance and trade-off via welfare economic analysis
- ▶ **Examine** market failures such as externalities, monopoly, imperfect information and public goods

CLASS READINGS: There will be class handouts for each topic in the course. Any student who would like additional reading materials for the class is welcome to visit with the instructor.

TEACHING METHODS: Teaching methods include lectures, class discussion, homework assignments, quizzes, a mid-term and a final examination. Class and recitation discussion is encouraged, in order to extend and clarify lectures and reading. If you miss a lecture, it is your responsibility to obtain the material missed.

ASSIGNMENTS:

Three homework assignments will be made, based on problems set by the instructor. The first assignment will be given out during class on October 8th, and is due October 15th. The second assignment will be given out on October 22nd, and is due October 29th. The third assignment will be given out November 17th and is due November 24th. There will be a 5% point deduction for each day an assignment is late. Your best two assignment marks will count towards your final grade.

EXAMINATIONS:

One mid-term, and a final examination will be given. The mid-term will be held during the sixth full week of the quarter on November 3rd. The final exam will be held from 7.30 – 9.18 am, Wednesday, December 9th. Questions on the exam will come from lectures. Types of question include definitions, short answer, true/false, and short essay.

ATTENDANCE:

Attendance in class is required, and accounts for 4% of the final grade. An attendance check will be made on a random basis. Legitimate reasons for non-attendance will be entertained.
