

## APPENDIX A:

### MONTGOMERY COUNTY, OHIO

#### TOWNSHIP ANNEXATIONS AND REVISIONS, 1960 TO 1998

It should be noted that when comparing township level population data from various years, data reflect annexations and boundary changes within the townships. A complete list of township level changes is included below.

##### 1960 to 1970<sup>1</sup>

Annexations: Part of Butler township annexed by Vandalia city, Parts of Clay and Perry townships annexed by Brookville village, Parts of Clay township annexed by Verona and Phillipsburg villages, Parts of Jefferson, Harrison, Madison and Mad River townships annexed by Dayton city, Parts of Jackson township annexed by Farmersville & New Lebanon villages, Part of Madison township annexed by Trotwood village, Parts of Miami township annexed by Miamisburg & West Carrollton cities and by Moraine city, Parts of Randolph township annexed by Clayton, Englewood and Union villages, Part of Washington township annexed by Kettering city, Part of Washington township annexed by Centerville city

Additional Annexations: None

Other: Centerville, Moraine and West Carrollton villages changed to cities, Carlisle village incorporated from part of Miami township

##### 1970 to 1980<sup>2</sup>

Annexations: Parts of Miami and Washington townships annexed to Kettering city, Parts of Jefferson & Miami townships annexed to Moraine city, Part of Butler township was annexed to Vandalia city, Part of Miami township annexed to West Carrollton City city,

Additional Annexations: by Trotwood, Miamisburg and Englewood cities and Brookville, Phillipsburg, Germantown, New Lebanon, Riverside and Union villages

Other: Wayne township no longer exists (part annexed to Dayton city and balance along with parts of Butler and Mad River township was incorporated as Huber Heights city, Oakwood city detached area to Kettering city and Kettering city detached area to Oakwood city, area was detached by Miamisburg city

##### 1980 to 1990<sup>3</sup>

Annexations: by Dayton city from Butler, Harrison, Jefferson, Madison and Mad River townships, by Moraine city from Miami township, by Vandalia city from Butler township, by West Carrollton City city from Miami township

Additional Annexations: by Brookville, Carlisle, New Lebanon & Riverside villages and Centerville, Englewood, Germantown, Miamisburg, Trotwood and Union cities

Other: Springboro city annexed into Montgomery County

Annexations: Randolph township merged with Clayton village (township no longer exists), Union city annexed into Butler township in Montgomery County, Madison township merged with Trotwood city, Mad River township area abolished as a result of Riverside city annexation and remainder becoming Wright Patterson AFB unorganized territory, Clayton village merged with Randolph and Clay townships (Clay township no longer exists)
