






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OHIO FARM INCOME

The district estimates in this year's publication for 2001 and 2002 are divided into the revised extension districts which changed from five districts to four districts. A map showing the districts is on page 29. Cash receipts during 2002, from Ohio's livestock, livestock products, and crops totaled \$4.28 billion , 5.5 percent below last year's \$4.53 billion. Cash receipts from all crops in 2002 were down .9 percent from 2001. Cash receipts from livestock in 2002 were 12.4 percent below the 2001 cash receipts from livestock.

The 2002 value of cash receipts for crops, at \$2.65 billion, was lower than 2000 and the second lowest since the 1992 value of \$2.56 billion. This value was down .9 percent from 2001, and 21.5 percent below the record high \$3.37 billion in 1997. The percentage of total farm marketings attributable to crops in 2002 was 61.9 percent, three points above the revised 2001 data.

The 2002 cash receipts for livestock and livestock products totaled \$1.63 billion, down 12.4 percent from last year and 16.8 percent below the record set in 1996. The percentage of total farm marketings earned by livestock and livestock products was 33.1 percent, three points below the revised 2001 cash receipts.

Government payments totaled \$279.0 million, 59.1 percent below last year's 681.7 million and the lowest since 1997. This represents 6.1 percent of total cash receipts including government payments.

Agriculture in Ohio made a net value added contribution of \$1.30 billion to the National economy in 2002, down 43.7 percent from 2001. The final agricultural sector output, at \$4.83 billion, was down 12.1 percent from 2001. Purchased inputs totaled \$2.77 billion, down 3.2 percent from last year. Capital consumption at \$834.4 million was up 3.2 percent from 2001, while payments to stakeholders at \$1.03 billion were down 11.7 percent.

The top five commodities in terms of cash receipts earned were **soybeans** with \$816.1 million and 19.1 percent of total receipts; **corn** with \$703.2 million and 16.5 percent of total receipts; **greenhouse and nursery** with \$569.0 million and 13.3 percent of total receipts; **wholesale milk** with \$560.7 million and 13.1 percent of total receipts; and **poultry and eggs** with \$433.0 million and 10.1 percent of total cash receipts. The commodities ranked sixth through tenth were cattle and calves, hogs, vegetables, wheat, and hay, respectively. The top ten commodities accounted for 95.5 percent of all Ohio cash receipts.

2002 OHIO FARM CASH RECEIPTS FROM TABLE II DATA





PROCEDURE

Estimates of cash receipts from Ohio farm marketings were published initially in 1927 and annually since 1929. These county estimates of cash receipts for 2002 are published by the Department of Agricultural, Environmental and Development Economics of the Ohio State University's College of Food, Agricultural, and Environmental Sciences and the Ohio Agricultural Research and Development Center in cooperation with the National Agricultural Statistics Service of the United States Department of Agriculture. This bulletin contains 2002 Ohio county and state cash receipts estimates, and revised 1998-2001 state estimates. Also included are revised 2001 county and state cash receipts estimates to reflect the changes in county data from the preliminary estimates published in 2001. County production and inventory estimates of various commodities are published annually in the Ohio Agricultural Statistics bulletin.

Current cash receipts from farm marketings of farm products represent calendar year gross receipts from commercial market sales as well as loans (net of redemptions) made or guaranteed by CCC and purchases under price support programs. The value of home consumption and production expenses is excluded. County estimates of cash receipts from farm marketings are derived by allocating state estimates to counties on the basis of crop and livestock production and Census marketings by Agricultural Statistics Districts. Check data such as county dairy production from the milk market administrators are also used.


The definition of a farm includes a place which has annual sales of agricultural products of \$1,000 or more. This definition has been used since the 1974 Census of Agriculture. The average cash receipts per farm will aid in the comparison of counties with similar farm practices better than a comparison of total cash receipts.

This bulletin has been prepared through the efforts of many people, including personnel of agricultural agencies throughout Ohio. The greatest recognition is due to the large number of Ohio farmers and agri-businessmen for their interest and help in providing the basic data used in compiling this information.


