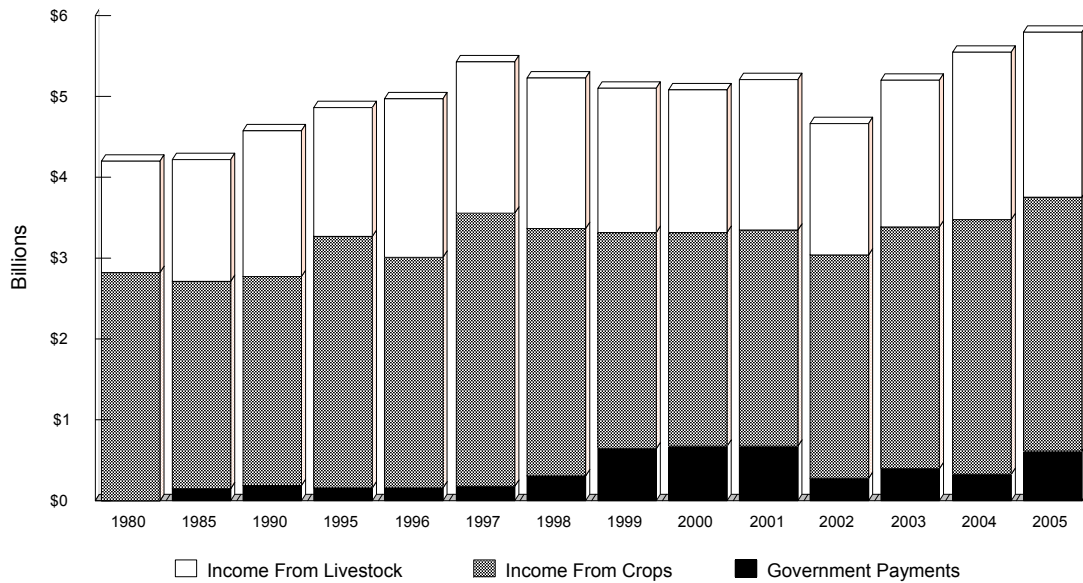
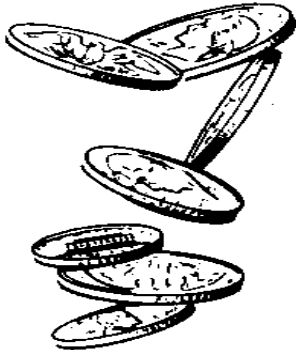

OHIO FARM INCOME

This is the Second year in which the format was revised to exclude county extension districts. Counties are instead listed in alphabetical order. Cash receipts during 2005, from Ohio's livestock, livestock products, and crops totaled \$5.18 billion , 0.8 percent below last year's \$5.22 billion. Cash receipts from all crops in 2005 were down 0.3 percent from 2004. Cash receipts from livestock in 2005 were 1.3 percent below the 2004 cash receipts from livestock.

The 2005 value of cash receipts for crops at \$3.14 billion, the third highest value, was down 0.3 percent from 2004 and was 6.9 percent lower than the record of \$3.37 billion in 1997. The percentage of total farm marketings attributable to crops in 2005 was 60.6 percent, 0.3 point above the revised 2004 data.

The 2005 cash receipts for livestock and livestock products totaled \$2.04 billion, 1.3 percent lower than last year, and is the second highest on record. The percentage of total farm marketings earned by livestock and livestock products was 39.4 percent, 0.3 point below the revised 2004 cash receipts.

Government payments totaled \$614.3 million, 84.7 percent above last year's \$332.7 million. This represents 10.6 percent of total cash receipts including government payments.

Agriculture in Ohio made a net value added contribution of \$2.64 billion to the National economy in 2005, down from the \$2.70 billion in 2004. The agricultural sector output, at \$6.51 billion, was down 5.7 percent from 2004. Purchased inputs totaled \$3.26 billion, down 2.9 percent from last year. Capital consumption at \$941.0 million was up 4.1 percent from 2004, while payments to stakeholders at \$1.19 billion were up 5.6 percent.

The top five commodities in terms of cash receipts earned were soybeans with \$1.12 billion and 21.7 percent of total receipts; corn with \$794.1 million and 15.3 percent of total receipts; wholesale milk with \$744.7 million and 14.4 percent of total receipts; greenhouse and nursery with \$584.0 million and 11.3 percent of total receipts; and poultry and eggs with \$422.3 million and 8.1 percent of total cash receipts. The commodities ranked sixth through tenth were hogs, cattle and calves, wheat, vegetables and hay, respectively. The top ten commodities accounted for 95.8 percent of all Ohio cash receipts.

The following ten counties ranked first through tenth, respectively, based on total cash receipts: Mercer, Darke, Wayne, Putnam, Holmes, Licking, Wood, Hardin, Fulton and Lorain. Wayne county ranked first in milk, and cattle and calves, and oats & hay. Mercer county ranked first in cash receipts for hogs, poultry and other livestock. Darke county was in first place for corn and soybeans. Wood county was first for wheat, and Lorain county ranked number one for other crops.

This year's report includes publication of revised data by county for 2004 in addition to the 2005 preliminary data. The publication of the revised 2004 data by county permits a better comparison of the two years after the revisions have been made to reflect more complete data.

2005 OHIO FARM CASH RECEIPTS FROM TABLE II DATA**

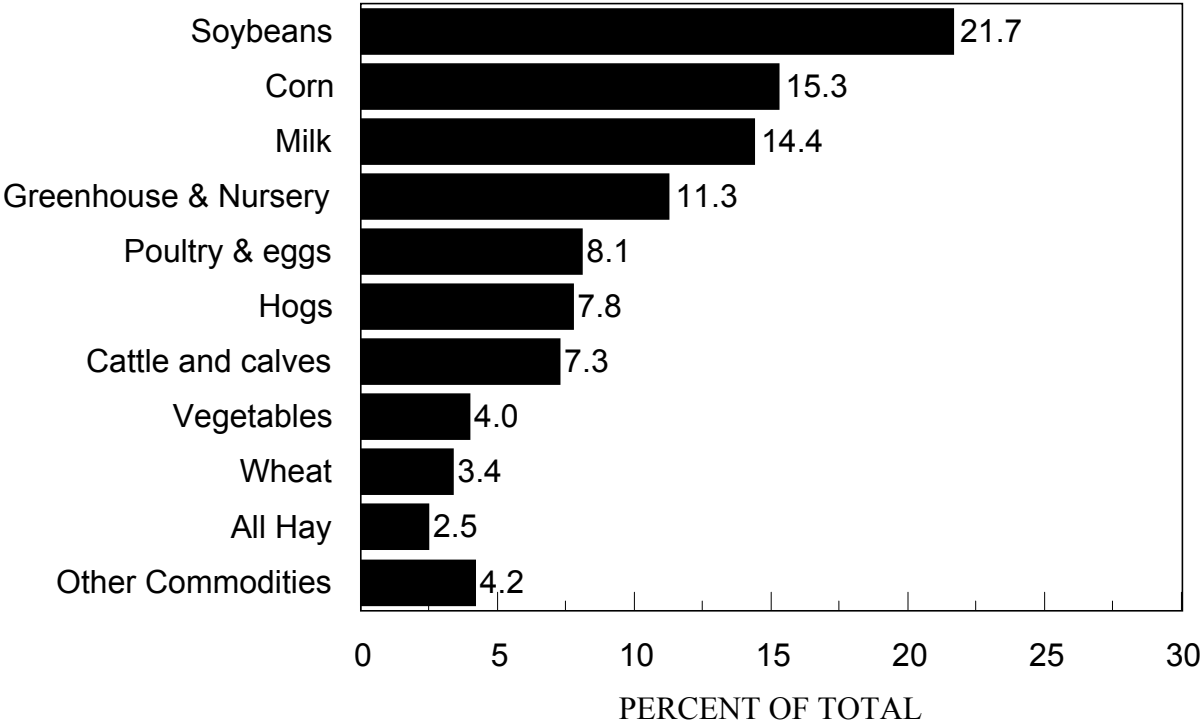

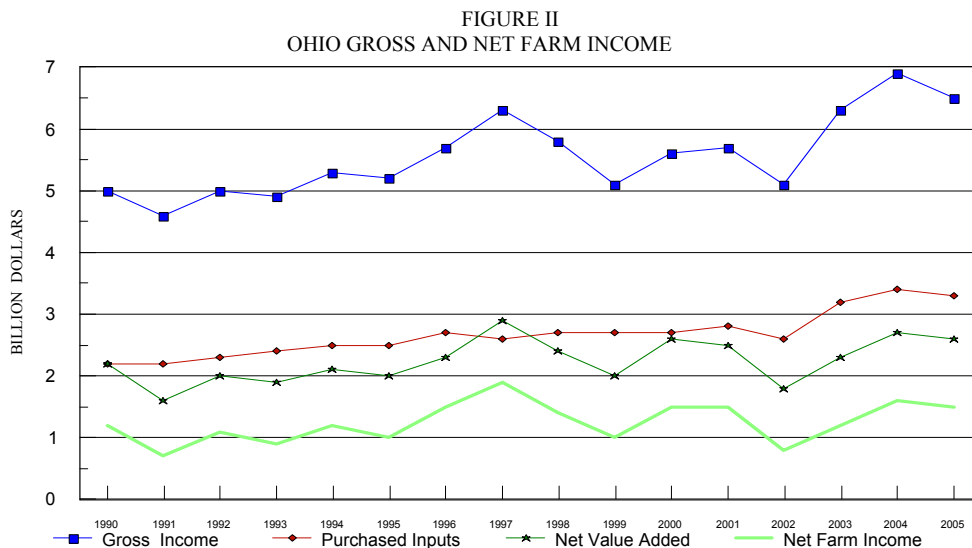

PROCEDURE

Estimates of cash receipts from Ohio farm marketings were published initially in 1927 and annually since 1929. These county estimates of cash receipts for 2005 are published by the Department of Agricultural, Environmental and Development Economics of the Ohio State University's College of Food, Agricultural, and Environmental Sciences and the Ohio Agricultural Research and Development Center in cooperation with the National Agricultural Statistics Service of the United States Department of Agriculture. This bulletin contains preliminary 2005 Ohio county and state cash receipts estimates, and revised 1999-2004 state estimates. Also included are revised 2004 county and state cash receipts estimates to reflect the changes in county data from the preliminary estimates published in 2004. County production and inventory estimates of various commodities are published annually in the Ohio Agricultural Statistics bulletin. For the 2005 edition, the format was revised to list counties in alphabetical order rather than by extension districts.

Current cash receipts from farm marketings of farm products represent calendar year gross receipts from commercial market sales as well as loans (net of redemptions) made or guaranteed by CCC and purchases under price support programs. The value of home consumption and production expenses is excluded. County estimates of cash receipts from farm marketings are derived by allocating state estimates to counties on the basis of crop and livestock production and Census marketings. Check data such as county dairy production from the milk market administrators are also used.

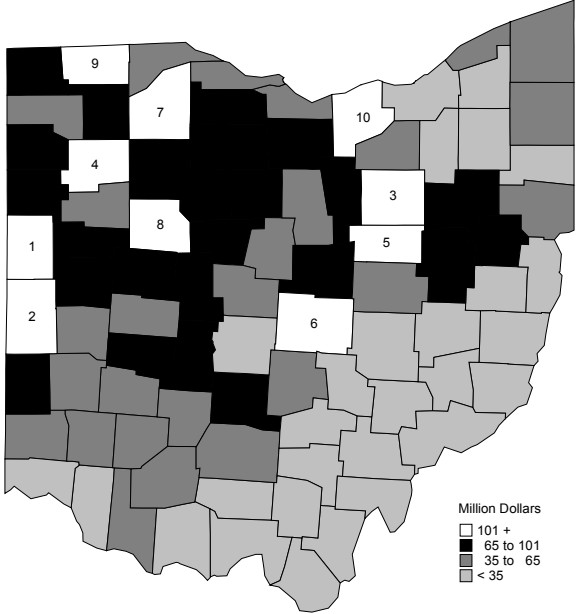
The definition of a farm includes a place which has annual sales of agricultural products of \$1,000 or more. This definition has been used since the 1974 Census of Agriculture. The average cash receipts per farm will aid in the comparison of counties with similar farm practices better than a comparison of total cash receipts.

This bulletin has been prepared through the efforts of many people, including personnel of agricultural agencies throughout Ohio. The greatest recognition is due to the large number of Ohio farmers and agri-businessmen for their interest and help in providing the basic data used in compiling this information.

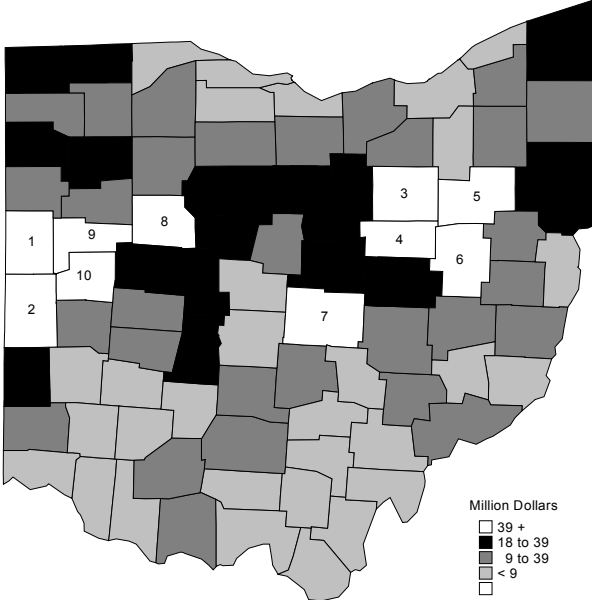
