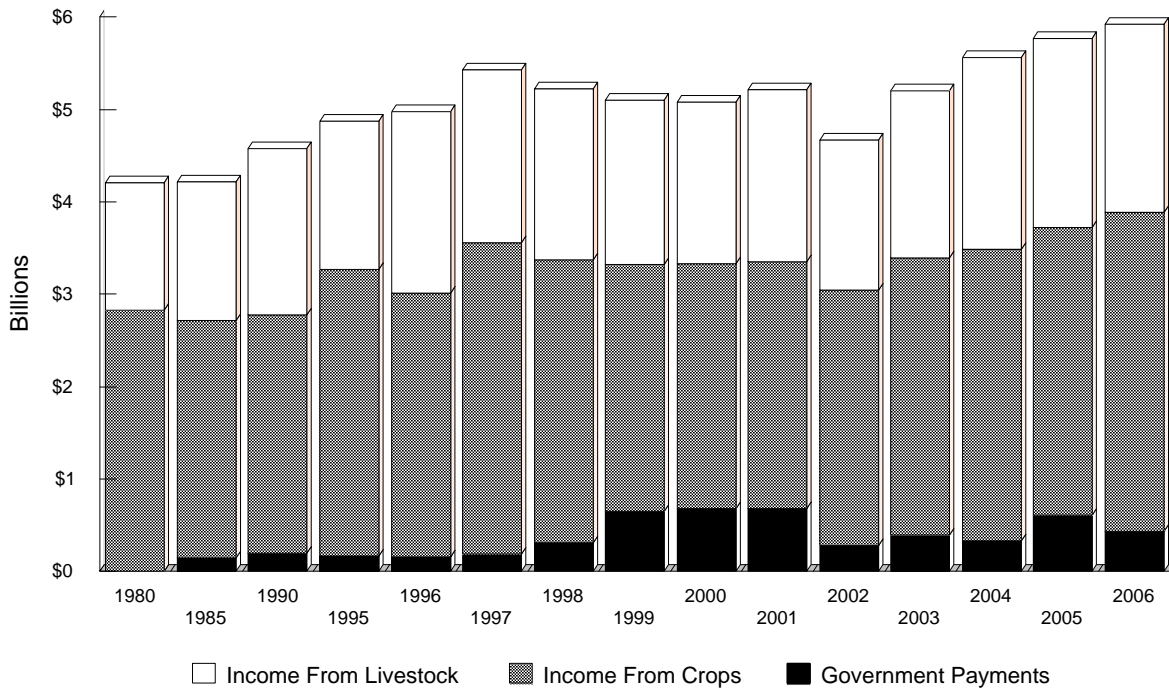
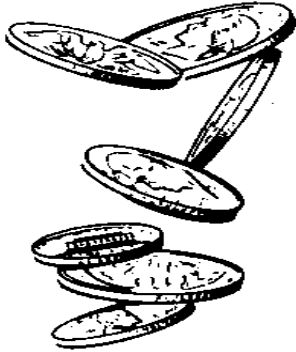

OHIO FARM INCOME

This is the third year the format was revised to exclude county extension districts. Instead, counties are listed in alphabetical order. Cash receipts during 2006, from Ohio's livestock, livestock products, and crops totaled \$5.48 billion, 6.3 percent above last year's \$5.15 billion. Cash receipts from all crops in 2006 were up 11.1 percent from 2005. Cash receipts from livestock in 2006 were 0.9 percent below the 2005 cash receipts from livestock.

The 2006 value of cash receipts for crops is \$3.45 billion. Based on the preliminary estimates the 2006 crops cash receipts breaks the record set in 1997 representing an 11.0 percent increase from 2005 and a 2.2 percent increase over the record of \$3.37 billion in 1997. The percentage of total farm marketings attributable to crops in 2006 was 62.9 percent, 2.7 percentage points above the revised 2005 data.

The 2006 cash receipts for livestock and livestock products totaled \$2.03 billion. This is the third highest total of all time, and is 0.9 percent lower than last year and 2.0 percent below the \$2.07 billion record set in 2004. The percentage of total farm marketings from livestock and livestock products is 37.1 percent, 2.7 percentage points below the revised 2005 cash receipts.

Government payments totaled \$442 million, 28.2 percent below last year's \$615 million. This represents 7.5 percent of total cash receipts including government payments.

Ohio agriculture contributed a net value added of \$2.73 billion to the National economy in 2006, up from \$2.58 billion in 2005 but below the \$2.77 billion of 2004. The final agricultural sector output, at \$6.83 billion, is up 6.0 percent from 2005. Purchased inputs totaled \$3.24 billion, down 0.27 percent from last year. Capital consumption is at \$986.1 million up 4.2 percent from 2005, while payments to stakeholders at \$1.11 billion are down 1.5 percent.

The top five commodities in terms of cash receipts earned were soybeans with \$1.16 billion and 21.2 percent of total receipts; corn with \$986.7 million and 18.0 percent of total receipts; wholesale milk with \$666.5 million and 12.2 percent of total receipts; greenhouse and nursery with \$604.4 million and 11.0 percent of total receipts; and poultry and eggs with \$469.3 million and 8.6 percent of total cash receipts. The commodities ranked sixth through tenth were cattle and calves, hogs, vegetables, wheat, and hay, respectively. The top ten commodities accounted for 95.8 percent of all Ohio cash receipts.

The following ten counties ranked first through tenth, respectively, based on total cash receipts: Mercer, Darke, Wayne, Putnam, Licking Wood, Holmes, Hardin, Fulton and Madison. Wayne county ranked first in milk, cattle and calves, and oats & hay. Mercer county ranked first in cash receipts for hogs, poultry and other livestock. Darke county was in first place for corn and soybeans. Wood county was first for wheat, and Lorain county ranked number one for other crops.

This year's report includes publication of revised data by county for 2005 in addition to the 2006 preliminary data. The publication of the revised 2005 data by county permits a better comparison of the two years after the revisions have been made to reflect more complete data.

2006 OHIO FARM CASH RECEIPTS FROM TABLE II DATA

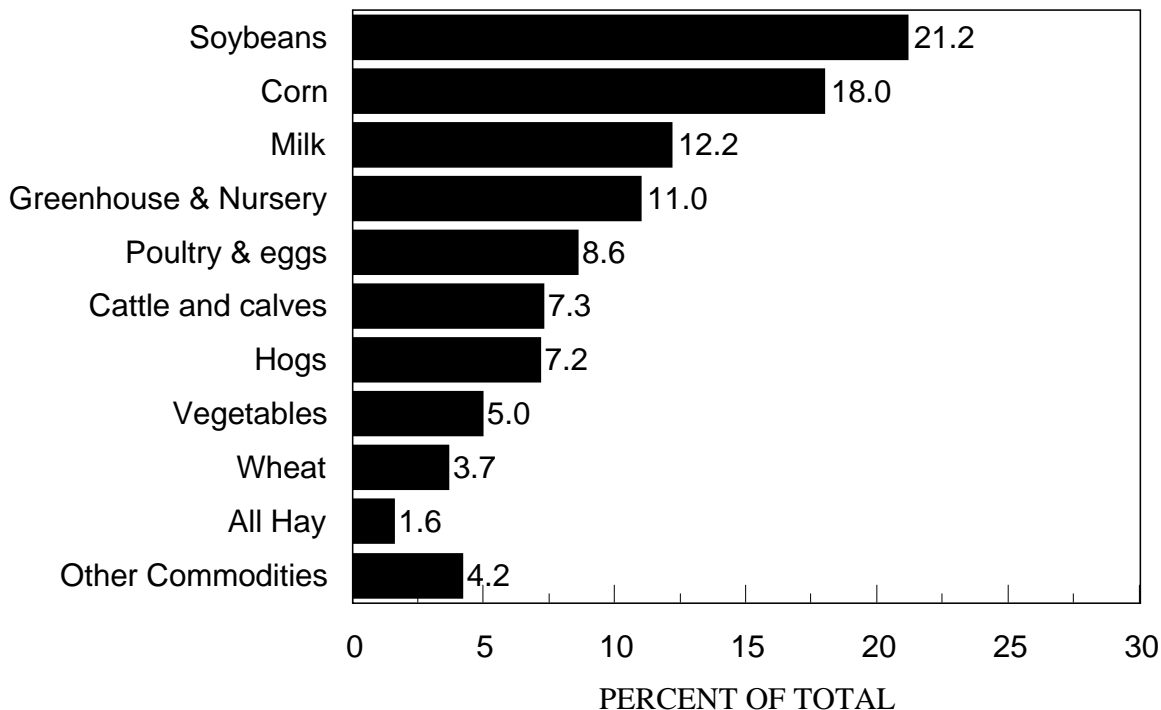

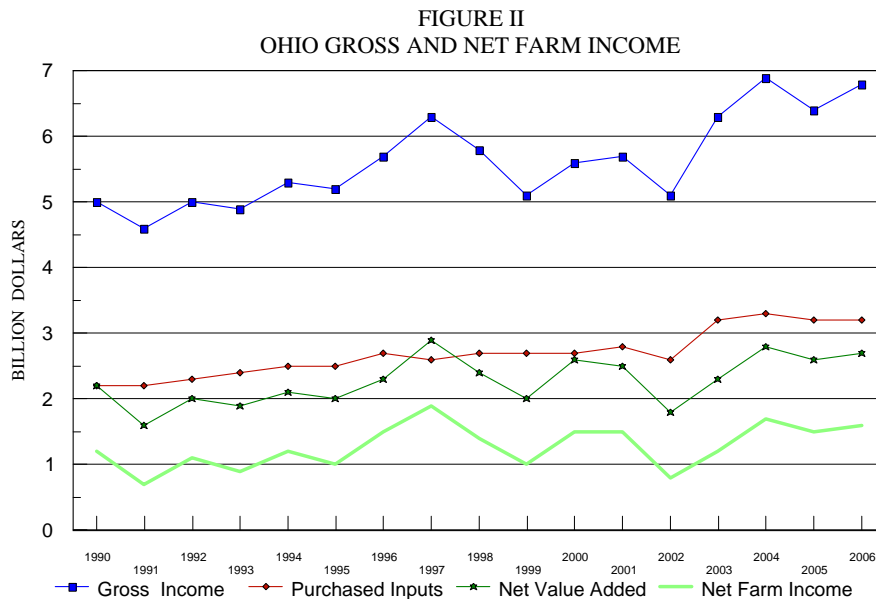

PROCEDURE

Estimates of cash receipts from Ohio farm marketings were published initially in 1927 and annually since 1929. These county estimates of cash receipts for 2006 are published by the Department of Agricultural, Environmental and Development Economics of the Ohio State University's College of Food, Agricultural, and Environmental Sciences and the Ohio Agricultural Research and Development Center in cooperation with the National Agricultural Statistics Service of the United States Department of Agriculture. This bulletin contains preliminary 2006 Ohio county and state cash receipts estimates, and revised 1999-2005 state estimates. Also included are revised 2005 county and state cash receipts estimates to reflect the changes in county data from the preliminary estimates published in 2005. County production and inventory estimates of various commodities are published annually in the Ohio Agricultural Statistics bulletin. For the 2006 edition, the format was revised to list counties in alphabetical order rather than by extension districts.

Current cash receipts from farm marketings of farm products represent calendar year gross receipts from commercial market sales as well as loans (net of redemptions) made or guaranteed by CCC and purchases under price support programs. The value of home consumption and production expenses is excluded. County estimates of cash receipts from farm marketings are derived by allocating state estimates to counties on the basis of crop and livestock production and Census marketings. Check data such as county dairy production from the milk market administrators are also used.

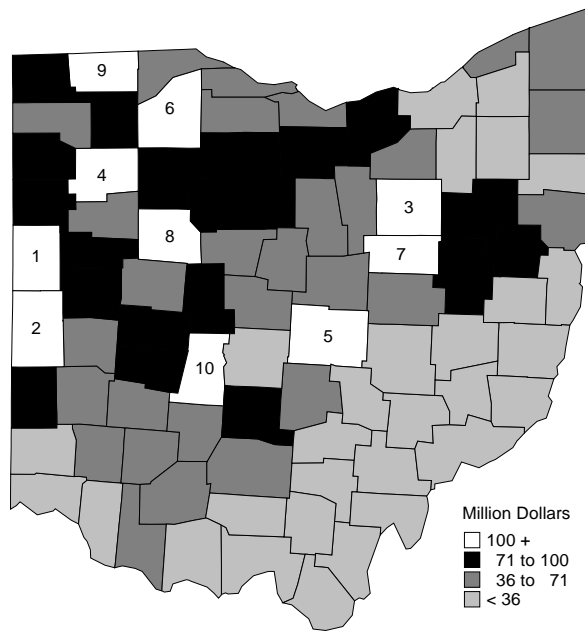
The definition of a farm includes a place which has annual sales of agricultural products of \$1,000 or more. This definition has been used since the 1974 Census of Agriculture. The average cash receipts per farm will aid in the comparison of counties with similar farm practices better than a comparison of total cash receipts.

This bulletin has been prepared through the efforts of many people, including personnel of agricultural agencies throughout Ohio. The greatest recognition is due to the large number of Ohio farmers and agri-businessmen for their interest and help in providing the basic data used in compiling this information.

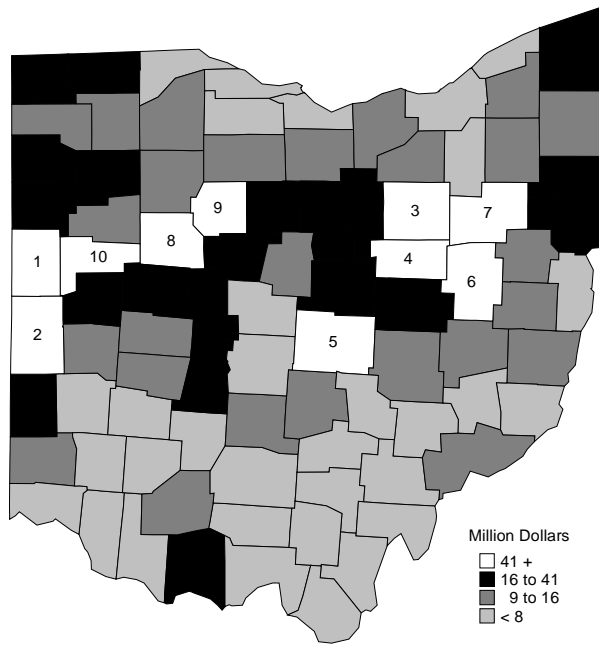
